In addition, contractors need to display strong safety principles in the workplace to be eligible for a ZISA. According to the NMAPC website, "Basic to the zero injury philosophy and common among these contractors is the view that no injury is treated as an acceptable event in the execution of the work. These contractors also have a commitment they will do whatever it takes

to prevent the next injury. In short, it is their performance expectation there will be no injuries, and line managers and workers alike are so informed."
